These</p>	<p>subjects are to be discovered both in his well-known published oeuvre as a fashion photographer as well as in his personal work, and the show includes a number of photographs specially taken for this exhibition and seen here for the first time. For Mario Testino, the heart of Todo o Nada lies in contemplating the process and implications involved in the act of removing one's clothes and becoming</p>
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naked. As he says, 'The pictures start fully clothed and end naked. But where does fashion photography end and portraiture begin?' To this end, the exhibition includes photographs in which the models wear elaborate dresses, in sets specifically created for each picture and characterised by a deliberate theatricality, contrasted with others in which they are

seen starkly unclothed, referring to iconic Plates of Spanish art such as Goya's *Majas*. The exhibition also reveals many dimensions of the relationship between the photographer and his models. From the glamour of the most famously beautiful women in the world, nude, or wearing haute couture (often photographed with a touch of irony and a provocative sense of humour), to

more intimate, oblique and spontaneous moments, *Todo o Nada* is an ode to 'Testino's woman'. He has defined and redefined his way of seeing a woman over the course of his career. She is a woman who moves between totally opposing poles: 'I like strong, independent women. Women who, despite their strength, never lose their femininity and who do not

use their beauty as a tool. Women with personality who can reflect their own desires and ours.' Within the concept of the show, Testino's intention has been to establish a dialogue with the Museum's collection. In his words: 'Exhibiting in a museum such as the Thyssen-Bornemisza with its extraordinary collection is a privilege for any artist working today, particularly

given that many of the artists and Plates in the collection have influenced my own work and inspired me. The Museum is remarkable, not just for the collection that it houses, but also for the space, which enhances the work of any artist.'

Close Up was the first English-language journal of film theory. Published between 1927 and 1933, it

billed itself as "the only magazine devoted to film as an art," promising readers "theory and analysis: no gossip." The journal was edited by the writer and filmmaker Kenneth Macpherson, the novelist Winifred Bryher, and the poet H. D., and it attracted contributions from such major figures as Dorothy Richardson, Sergei Eisenstein, and Man Ray. This anthology presents some

of the liveliest and most important articles from the publication's short but influential history. The writing in *Close Up* was theoretically astute, politically incisive, open to emerging ideas from psychoanalysis, passionately committed to "pure cinema," and deeply critical of Hollywood and its European imitators. The articles collected here cover such subjects as

women and film, "The Negro in Cinema," Russian and working-class cinema, and developments in film technology, including the much debated addition of sound. The contributors are a cosmopolitan cast, reflecting the journal's commitment to internationalism; *Close Up* was published from Switzerland, printed in England and France, and distributed in Paris, Berlin,

London, New York, and Los Angeles. The editors of this volume present a substantial introduction and commentaries on the articles that set *Close Up* in historical and intellectual context. Over the last 20 years, Hellen van Meene has produced a complex body of work, offering a contemporary take on photographic portraiture. Characterized by her exquisite use of light, formal elegance and palpable psychological tension, her

depictions of girls and boys on the cusp of adulthood demonstrate a clear aesthetic lineage to seventeenth-century Dutch painting. Van Meene captures the intimacy in the photographer-subject relationship, bringing out a sense of honesty and vulnerability from within her models and highlighting the beauty of imperfection. She carefully poses her subjects in their environments

to emphasize their fragility, adding a palpable tension to the photographs. At the same time, she captures them at deeper, more introspective moments-- masterfully moving between the staged nature of the portraits and the real experiences of her subjects. The combination of van Meene's instinctive understanding of the universality of adolescent experience

and the highly intimate collaboration between photographer and model makes for powerful portraits that resonate long after viewing. This book brings together more than 250 images, for the most comprehensive presentation of the artist's work to date. Hellen van Meene (born 1972) studied photography at the Gerrit Rietveld Academie, Amsterdam. Her work has been exhibited
